From the Office of the Chief

Crime rates for the month of January remained lower when compared to January 2017. Violent crime, in particular, continues to decline with an overall drop at the end of 2017 by 11% and a decline in January 2018 by 24% (when compared to January of 2017). Violent crime for the month of January 2018 was down in aggravated assault, simple assault, and remained flat in the categories of rape and homicide. The only violent crime category that saw a slight increase in January 2018, when compared to the same month in 2017, was robbery. This decrease in violent crime is great news for Citrus Heights as this comes at a time when violent crimes in other California communities saw a significant increase. According to early FBI/DOJ statistic reporting, early indications show that of the 73 largest and medium-sized California cities listed in the report, 56% of those saw an increase in violent crime during 2017, while Citrus Heights experienced an 11% decrease.

Property crime in Citrus Heights for January also saw a decrease of 16% when compared to January 2017. Larceny, motor-vehicle theft, and arson-related offenses were all down for this past month, while burglary experienced an increase of 26%.

Traffic collisions for January are down considerably when compared to the same month in 2017, with a total decrease of 20%. Property damage collisions were down 19%, and injury collisions were down 18%. We did not have any traffic fatalities in January 2018. DUI related traffic collisions are up slightly for January and we continue to make DUI enforcement a priority.

For the past month, your police department has been specifically focused on combating burglaries and thefts from vehicles as well as DUI enforcement; these concentrated efforts will continue through February and beyond. We greatly encourage our community to practice heightened awareness and remind you to always lock your car when parked. Do not leave anything of value in the vehicle, visible or not, to be safe. As well, always plan ahead to utilize a ride-share or designated driver when drinking alcohol. Getting ripped off is never fun, but being arrested for a DUI will have a dramatic, negative impact on your life, and, potentially, those around you.

THE PLANNING DIVISION

The Planning Division coordinates the City's review of residential and commercial development projects. The Division evaluates the project for compliance with the City's General Plan, Zoning Code, and other City Standards.

Below is a selected list of projects currently under review:

7925 Arcadia Drive – Mitchell Farms: an application was received to develop a 39 acre parcel offering a variety of housing types for a total of 261 units. The project is currently in the environmental review process.

6920 Auburn Boulevard – Stock Ranch pad building: an application is under review to allow the construction of a 10,000 sf multi-tenant pad building within the Stock Ranch Development.

7000 Auburn Boulevard – Costco Gas Station expansion: an application is under review that would allow the addition of three pump dispensers (six filling locations) to the existing gas station.

7078 Auburn Boulevard – Auburn Heights: an application was received requesting a tentative map, design review permit, and minor variance to construct an 8-unit attached single-family development on a small infill lot.

8501 Auburn Boulevard – Studio Movie Grill: an application has been submitted that would reformat an existing vacant space (former K-Mart store) into a movie theater with food and drink

THE PLANNING DIVISION (cont.)

5905 Country Lane – expansion of Country Lane Apartments: an application to construct an additional seven townhome-style apartment units within an existing apartment community is under review.

7117 Oakberry Way – well reactivation: Cal-Am Water is proposing to reactivate a non-operational well. The reactivation will include the installation of a new pump system and storage equipment.

7534 Old Auburn Road – Bear Paw Apartments: a 43-unit apartment project was approved by the Planning Commission on January 24, 2018 however, the approval was appealed. The project will be presented to City Council on April 12, 2018 for final review and decision.

6041/6199 Sunrise Boulevard: applications were received to subdivide portions of the parking area of Sunrise Mall into individual parcels. One parcel is located where the existing US Bank is currently located; the other is in the area of the Elephant Bar Restaurant.





Voting has changed in Sacramento County!



How to Vote in Three Easy Steps:

Sacramento County is one of five counties in California to implement the Voter's Choice Act (VCA), expanding voting opportunities for all residents. Beginning with the June 2018 Primary Election, all registered voters will receive a ballot in the mail, and Vote Centers will take the place of traditional polling sites. The Sacramento County Department of Voter Registration and Elections explains the voting process in three simple steps:

Get It - Twenty-nine days prior to Election Day, all voters will be mailed a ballot. Look for your pink envelope!

Mark It – Mark your ballot and sign your envelope. Voters with disabilities can download their ballot at home using the new accessible Vote by Mail system.

Return It – Return your marked ballot in the mail or in person at any Vote Center or Ballot Drop Box.

Vote Centers are replacing polling places, and:

...open 10 days prior to Election Day ...you decide which Vote Center to use



Baird Way Drainage Improvements	Installation of new drainage inlets and pipes to increase capacity to eliminate recurring nuisance ponding at Baird Way & Holly Dr.	Construction is expected to commence in Spring 2018 and take 1-2 months to complete.
Storm Drain System Yearly Cleaning	Cleaning of the storm drain system to prevent street flooding.	Regular storm drain cleaning program for this year is complete; Contractor remains available to assist clearing clogged storm drains during storm events.
2018 Accessibility and Drainage Improvements (various streets)	Project upgrades ADA sidewalk access ramps and substandard drainage inlets and laterals at various locations in the City. The 2018 project will concentrate work in Neighborhood Area 2.	Project is currently in design and expected to start construction in late Summer 2018.
