## Citrus Heights Community Center

Currently, Community Center bookings have reached 2567, and staff continues to book events daily. We are booked out one year in advance but receive many requests for two to three years ahead. Our goal for event totals for fiscal year 2012/13 is an additional 2,000 bookings. We are averaging 65 event bookings a month and handling more than 75 calls a day.



## Sylvan Community Center

The Sylvan Community Center located at 7521 Community Drive in Citrus Heights is now open. The City is accepting rental applications for one-time use events and recurring meetings. The Sylvan Community Center facility is furnished with tables and chairs and includes a full kitchen and bathroom facilities. Parking is also available on site. The maximum building capacity for a meeting or general assembly is 65 people or 50 people for a dinner or banquet. The Sylvan Community Center is an alcohol and smoke free venue. 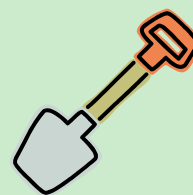

# Road Construction Projects

Project	Status
Sunrise Blvd Complete Streets Phase I – Oak Ave to Antelope Rd	Teichert resumed work on Sunrise Boulevard on January 8 <sup>th</sup> and continues to focus on completing the curb, gutter, sidewalk and driveway entrances along the east side. Teichert expects to complete this work and related patch paving by late February. Teichert's signal subcontractor has installed the new signal systems at Antelope Road, Old Auburn Road and Oak Avenue and expects to have the new signals operational by late February. A schedule for the final paving, striping and landscaping, which are more weather dependent operations, is being reviewed, but the project team anticipates a late March completion.
Watson Way Drainage Improvements Project (Area 6&7 Master Plan Implementation)	30% plans and estimate were reviewed and comments provided to the consultant. Project is scheduled for construction in early spring.
Antelope Rd Accessibility and Safety Improvements Project	The project is currently on winter weather suspension, and the final micro-surfacing and restriping (on both Antelope Road and Lauppe Lane) has been postponed until April when the average daytime temperatures are high enough to ensure a quality product.
Mariposa Ave Safe Routes to School Phase II Sidewalk Infill Project	The project is complete and has been field accepted by GSD staff. The contractor is currently cleaning up some project documentation in anticipation of Final Acceptance at the City Council meeting in late February.
2012 Bus Stop Improvements Project, Phase II	The design consultant, Dokken Engineering, has submitted the 65% plan set, and the project team and RT are currently reviewing them. Construction will occur in the spring of 2013.
FEMA Update to Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs)	The consultant completed the first round of elevation certificates and letters of map amendments (LOMAs). Approximately 137 certificates and 111 LOMAs were submitted to FEMA for review and approval.
Sunrise Blvd Complete Streets Improvements - Phase 3 (Antelope Road to north City Limits - west side only)	In late January, Caltrans requested a third revision to the City's Request for Authorization (RFA) to Acquire Right-of-Way. Staff is awaiting approval of the RFA in order to start the acquisition process. A public information meeting for residents along the project route will be held in March.
2012 Auburn Boulevard Resurfacing Project	Contractor completed extending the block wall on the west side of Auburn between Sandalwood and Twin Oaks. Contractor will return late March to clean, prime and paint the wall. Project will be complete after this work.

Local Landmark Designated as Point of Historical Interest:

The California Office of Historic Preservation awarded the 14-Mile House as a point of Historic Interest. This landmark is significant in California history because it was built in 1849, being one of the oldest wooden structures in Sacramento County.

Established as the North Fork House, but remembered as the 14-Mile House the name representing the mile intervals from the City of Sacramento along Auburn Blvd. The roadhouse was used to accommodate the miners during the gold rush era towards the Sierra Nevada.

## Cancer Prevention Study-3

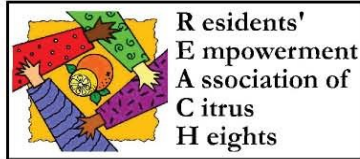

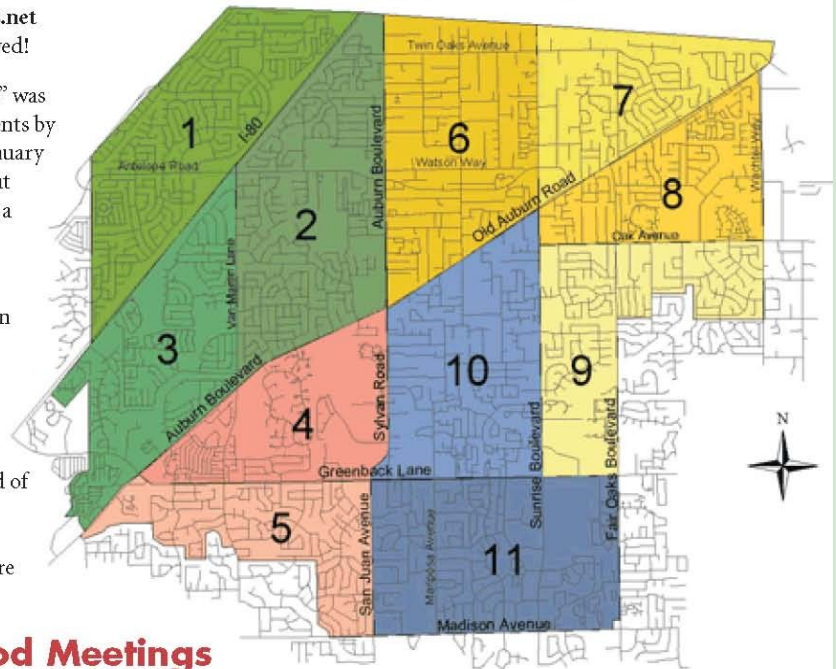

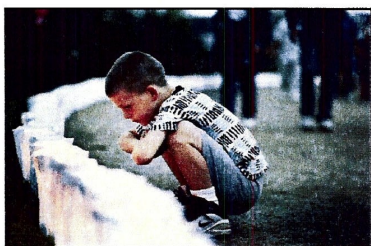

Relay For Life, a 24-hour team event to fight cancer, is the signature fundraising activity of the American Cancer Society. Each Relay is made up of teams of 10-15 participants who take turns running or walking around a local track to raise money for research, cancer education, patient service programs, and advocacy. In 2005, more than 4,300 communities nationwide hosted a Relay and with the help of people like you, Relay For Life has become the largest activity of its kind, raising more than \$375 million in 2006! But more than a fundraiser, Relay For Life is:

**A time to honor cancer survivors:** At every Relay For Life, all cancer survivors in the community are honored for their courage and strength by kicking off the event in the Survivors' Lap. Survivors are celebrated throughout the day with complimentary breakfast, a free t-shirt, games and more!

**A community united:** Few events bring together all components of a community like Relay For Life. Games, food, fun, music, and activities fill the air of every Relay For Life as everyone unites to help eliminate cancer!



**A ceremony of hope and remembrance:** Survivors and those who are no longer with us are honored at this one-of-a-kind ceremony. Paper bags bearing the names of loved ones are filled with sand and a small candle that is lit at dusk. These bags line the track and are left burning throughout the night. This moving, memorable ceremony is often the most powerful time of the entire Relay For Life.

### CPS-3 Enrollment - Sacramento, CA

#### CANCER PREVENTION STUDY-3 (CPS-3)

Research today for a cancer-free tomorrow.

The Cancer Prevention Study-3 (CPS-3) is helping to create a world with less cancer...and more birthdays. CPS-3 is a grassroots effort where local communities from across the country can support cancer research not just through fundraising efforts, but also by participating actively in this historic research study.

The American Cancer Society's Epidemiology Research Program is inviting men and women between the ages of 30 and 65 years who have never personally been diagnosed with cancer to join this historic study. The ultimate goal is to enroll at least 300,000 adults from various racial/ethnic backgrounds from across the U.S. The purpose of CPS-3 is to better understand the lifestyle, behavioral, environmental and genetic factors that cause or prevent cancer and to ultimately eliminate cancer as a major health problem for this and future generations.

Participation is easy and enrollment is available in your local community. Your initial enrollment requires two steps and will involve the following:

- After scheduling your enrollment appointment, you will receive a confirmation e-mail with instructions to go online and complete your first, most comprehensive survey. This survey will ask you questions regarding medications you are taking, family history of cancer, lifestyle and other behaviors. ***This survey should be completed prior to your appointment time.***
- At your appointment, you will be asked to sign an informed consent form, complete a brief survey, as well as provide a waist circumference measurement and a small blood sample (similar to a doctor's visit). The blood sample will be taken by a certified, trained phlebotomist. Your appointment should last approximately 20 - 30 minutes.
