Introduction

The city's 2021 Action Plan was adopted on October 22, 2020, and was based on the city's estimated 2021 grant amount. On February 25, 2021, the city received notification its FY 2021 allocation was \$637,979. On May 13, 2021, the city received a revised letter from HUD with an updated allocation of \$647,381 in PY 2021 entitlement funds. The city distributed the funding in accordance with the approved 2021 Action Plan. Since the Action Plan was adopted, the city has decided to cancel the 2021 Accessibility and Drainage Project. This amendment would cancel the 2021 Accessibility and Improvement Project and reallocate the funding allocated to this activity to the Signalized Intersection Improvement Project (increased allocation) and the Greenback Complete Streets Project (new activity).
