Redistricting Process

Step	Description					
Public Hearing #1 February 10, 2022	 Held prior to release of draft maps Educate, solicit input on neighborhoods and Communities of Interest 					
Public Submit Draft Maps February 17, 2022	One week after final pre-draft hearingOne week before first post-draft hearing					
Public Hearing #2 February 24, 2022	 Held after release of draft maps Educate, solicit input on neighborhoods and Communities of Interest Discuss and revise draft maps; discuss election sequencing 					
Community Forum March 3, 2022	 Public workshop to seek public input on neighborhoods and Communities of Interest 					
Public Hearing #3 March 10, 2022	 Public and Council deliberation on Map options Council vote on preferred map and introduce the ordinance 					
Public Hearing #4 March 24, 2022	 Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption Map adopted via ordinance 					



Redistricting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population
Federal Voting Rights Act
No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria for Cities

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest"

(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)

- 3. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 4. Compact

(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

Prohibited:

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

Minimize voters shifted to different election years

Respect voters' choices / continuity in office

Future population growth

Preserving the core of existing districts

Estimates using official 2020 demographic data and NDC's estimated total population figures.


Each of the 5 districts must contain about 17,570 people.




Latino CVAP

Lane








Defining Neighborhoods

1st Question: What is your neighborhood?

2nd Question: What are its geographic boundaries?

Examples of physical features defining a neighborhood boundary:

- □ Natural neighborhood dividing lines, such as highway or major roads, rivers, canals and/or hills
- Areas around parks or schools
- Other neighborhood landmarks

In the absence of public testimony, planning records and other similar documents may provide definition.





Beyond Neighborhoods: Defining Communities of Interest

1st Question: What defines your community?

- □ Geographic Area, plus
- □ Shared issue or characteristic
 - Shared social or economic interest
 - Impacted by county policies
- □ Tell us "your community's story"

2nd Question: Would this community benefit from being "included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation"?

Or would it benefit more from having multiple representatives?

Definitions of Communities of Interest may <u>not</u> include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.
